CONTACTING YOUR REPRESENTATIVES

Sharing your thoughts with the people who represent you at the local, state and national level is easy and vital to the functioning of our democracy. When an issue or legislation arises that you care about, contact your representatives by email, phone and request a meeting to ensure that your voice is heard. Virtually all elected officials have access to virtual meetings.

Tips for Communicating with Elected Officials

- Don't be intimidated, you don't need to know everything, just share your perspective.
- Email is now the preferred method of communication, but phone calls and letters are still effective.
- To comment on a specific bill, visit the bill page (leg.wa.gov/billinfo) and select "comment on this bill."
- Be courteous and to the point.
- Keep letters to one page.
- Letters to elected officials should be addressed to "Position" plus name, as in "Councilmember Jane Doe."
- Describe specifically and in your own words how an issue or legislation will affect you or others you know.
- Include the bill number or its popular name if you are commenting on specific legislation.
- Be sure to give your name, address, email address and phone number.
- Ask for a response.
- Give positive feedback. Take the time to let your representatives know when they have done something of which you particularly approve.

Remember, your elected officials represent you!

Democracy Vouchers: In 2015, voters in Seattle adopted a publicly financed election system that allows city residents to contribute up to \$100 to eligible candidate(s) in city elections by using vouchers. The vouchers are funded through a property tax. Vouchers are available to participating candidates for all city elections. The intent of the program is to provide an alternative to special interest money in politics and enable greater diversity both of candidates running for office and the people getting involved in campaigns.

City council elections in Washington State are nonpartisan, and council members serve four-year, staggered terms. Mayors are either elected by voters and serve four-year terms (listed separately) or are selected by the council, serve two-year terms and preside over the council (listed with the other councilmembers).

Most council meetings are now being held remotely due to Covid. To find out where and how they are currently held, call or check online.

PRIMARIES IN WASHINGTON STATE

Washington has a "Top 2" Primary election system for most elections which means that the two candidates who receive the most votes in the Primary advance to the General Election, regardless of their party preference.

The exception to this is the Presidential Primary and the election of PCO's (precinct committee officers) where a voter must mark their political party on the outside of the ballot envelope and you must vote for a candidate from your declared party.

Candidates

Each candidate for partisan office may indicate a political party that they prefer. A candidate's party preference does not imply that the candidate is nominated or endorsed by the party, or that the party approves of or associates with that candidate.

Voters

Washington voters do not declare party affiliation as part of voter registration. In each race, you may vote for any candidate listed on the ballot. The two candidates who receive the most votes in the Primary advance to the General Election, regardless of their party preference. See explanation of presidential primary for an exception to this rule.

Political parties

Political parties do not have a guaranteed spot on the General Election ballot except in Presidential Elections. The two candidates who advance to the General Election may state a preference for the same party or different parties, or may choose not to state a preference. Parties are free to endorse candidates according to their own rules.

VOTING IN KING COUNTY

All elections in Washington State are by mail-in ballot.

If you are registered to vote in Washington State, you will automatically be mailed a ballot 20 days before Election Day. There are three ways to return your voted ballot:

- Mail it, making sure it is *postmarked* no later than Election Day. (No postage is required).
- Drop it off at any secure ballot drop box by 8:00 p.m. on Election Day.
- Return it in person to any Vote Center by 8:00 p.m. on Election Day.

If you misplace your ballot, or the dog eats it, you can request another one or print one yourself at home or at a Vote Center. Call King County elections (206-296-VOTE) for more information.

Make sure your vote is counted.

Carefully follow all instructions included with your ballot and remember:

- Your signature makes your vote count. The signature on every ballot envelope is verified against the voter's registration record. If your signature has changed, please update your records with King County Elections.
- Respond immediately if you are contacted by the Elections office. You may have forgotten to sign the return envelope or your signature may not match your voter registration record. You will have an opportunity to fix the problem.
- After you have voted, to track your ballot, go to VoteWA.gov, enter your name and birthdate, and select "Ballot Status" to see if your ballot has been received and counted.

Ballot Drop Boxes and Vote Centers

There are over 70 permanent ballot drop boxes as well as multiple Vote Centers around King County. Call or check online for locations. Ballots can be dropped off at any drop box in Washington.

Accessible voting options are available

In King County each Vote Center has at least one accessible voting unit with audio and visual technology which enables voters with limited vision and physical disabilities to vote independently. Call or check online for more information.

Alternative Language Options

King County provides voting material in Chinese, Vietnamese, English, Korean and Spanish. If you need language assistance or would like a ballot and/or voters' pamphlet in one of these languages, call 206-296-8683. Staff members fluent in these languages are able to take your call.

VOTER REGISTRATION

Who can register to vote?

To qualify to vote in Washington State, you must be a citizen of the US, a resident of Washington for at least 30 days, at least 18 years old by Election Day, and not currently confined to prison due to a felony conviction.

Voting Rights Restoration

There have been recent changes in state law that automatically allow those previously convicted of a felony to re-register to vote immediately upon release from prison. This means you can register to vote, even if you are under community custody or still owe court debt. If unsure of your status, contact the ACLU at 206-624-2180 or www.aclu-wa.org.

Young Voters

Sixteen and 17-year-olds can register to vote but their registration will not activate until they are 18, however 17-year-olds may also vote in a Primary Election if they will be 18 by the date of the General Election.

Address Confidentiality

Certain domestic violence/harassment victims can keep their address confidential to protect them from abuse/harassment. Contact the Address Confidentiality Program at 360-753-2972 for qualifications and to register. Do not use the standard voter registration methods if you want your address to remain private.

Where can I register?

Online voter registration is available on the Secretary of State's website at myvote.wa.gov. Mail-in registration forms can be downloaded from <https://www.sos.wa.gov/elections/print-voter-registration-forms.aspx>. Register in-person at your county elections office or a Vote Center.

What are the registration deadlines?

Online or mail-in registration must be *received* by the elections department at least 8 days before the election. Registration can be done in-person up to 8 p.m on election day.

What if I move?

You may update your registration the same way you register to vote, up to 8 days before the election in which you wish to vote. If an update is not made, you may still vote according to your previous address. Contact the elections department to obtain a ballot as it may not be forwarded by the post office.

If you have changed your name, complete a new voter registration form or contact King County Elections in writing with your registered and new names, date of birth, current address and signature.
